Outstanding Programmatic Accomplishments:

- **4-H Afterschool:** Serve as the Texas 4-H Afterschool Focus Group Advisor charged with coordinating the development of curriculum and other marketing pieces to support afterschool, conduct training on a district, regional, state and national level, seek out and secure grant funding to support afterschool programming and participate in National monthly teleconferences representing Texas. Accomplishments include:
 - ► Completion of 3 curriculums: Yea 4-H! An Afterschool Learning Adventure, K-2, 3-5, and 6-8
 - ► Curriculum sales have generated over \$15,600.00 for the 4-H Unit
 - ► Development of a Yea 4-H! exhibit and brochure provided at 21 events reaching 2,300
 - ► Managed two grants in afterschool totaling \$55,000
 - ► Taught 12 workshops related to afterschool from 2003-2008 reaching 400

District 10 Extension Program Specialist--4-H: Work in partnership with District Extension Administrator and Regional Program Director--4-H to manage the District 4-H program including event management and faculty and staff training. Also provide educational support to 4-H clientele and assist with state assignments as requested. Support provided as Extension Program Specialist:

- ► Coordinate 26 District 4-H activities involving an average of 2,300 youth annually
- ► Staff Training: 45 reaching 1,705; Training for adults/youth: 52 reaching 2,548
- ► Secure financial and in-kind donations to support District & State Events-- \$499,767
- ► Coordinate the State Share The Fun Contest at Texas 4-H Roundup
- ▶ Provide leadership in developing educational resources to support county programming

Take A Stand: Coordinating the development of the conflict management/bullying enrichment curriculum, Take A Stand. Curriculum is currently being pilot tested in 60 counties and will be released state-wide. Significant contributions include:

- ► Co-writer for three levels of curriculum: 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12 grade
- Secured a \$50,000 donation from Texas Rural Mediation Services for project
- ► Coordinated and conducted 8 training for pilot counties
- ► Coordinated Texas Teen Retreat and conducted the Pilot of the 9-12 grade curriculum with 100 teens
- ▶ Provide support to pilot counties

Texas 4-H Center: Served as Program & Marketing Director responsible for developing and managing the summer camping program and weekend retreats throughout the year. Coordinated recruitment, hiring and supervision of 18-20 college students during the summer. Collaborated with Texas 4-H Foundation and other Center Staff to seek out funding to support the facility and programs. Support provided at Texas 4-H Center:

- Served as Interim Director for 18 months overseeing the fiscal management, supervision of all departments and the transition of the 4-H Center from the 4-H Foundation to Texas Cooperative Extension.
- The Center Director annually recruits and supervises 19 interns that are responsible for the development and implementation of projects for the 2,500 youth that participate in the programs offered at the Texas 4-H Center each summer.
- Developed and maintained web site, exhibit and brochures for marketing the 4-H program.
- Annually \$50,000 is secured from legislature to support the operation of the Texas 4-H Center.
- Collaborator in establishing the Ropes Course at the 4-H Center.
