Members are invited and do contribute to professional development in addition to their annual dues. Texas Alpha Zeta has also made substantial contributions to the national endowment fund for ESP.

District and campus representatives are involved in getting members to apply for awards, grants and scholarships.

Global Relations:

Main activity in 2007 is developing guidelines for international and interstate training opportunities.

Member Recruitment/Retention:

Membership committee chair works with each district and campus unit in Alpha Zeta to conduct recruitment & renewals in appropriate ways.

Resource Development:

Headed up by Audit Committee to make sure we use our funds in a responsible and professional manner.

No committee as such. Every member is expected to keep good working relations with public officials.
